#### 6.1 Western Cape Communities Trust Meeting 3 – 5 December 2018

#### From Minutes of Ordinary Council Meeting 11 December 2018: Resolution 18.6159

It was also noted that a new dedicated bore would be needed to keep the sports field watered over the summer months. Signage including the dedication plaque to Neville Pootchemunka will also need upgrading.

## From Minutes of Ordinary Council Meeting 11 December 2018: Resolution 18.6166

Council has begun planning and consultation on a new airport terminal for Aurukun. A group of key staff met as the Project Management Committee on the 3 December 2018 to discuss the required scope of the project and to review progress to date.

CEO spoke to the Minutes of the New Airport Terminal Project Management Committee and noted that an extension until 9 March 2019 has been received for the appointment of a Project Manager.

#### 6.3 Animal Control Officer's Environmental Health Workshop

### From Minutes of Ordinary Council Meeting 11 December 2018: Resolution 18.6182

That Council

- (1) supports hosting an Animal Control Officer's Environmental Health workshop in Aurukun in 2019 and Tropical Public Health Services to progress this proposal, and
- (2) requires a report to be provided to January Special Council Meeting by Animal Control Officer on Palm Island Aboriginal Shire Council ACO/EHO Workshop held on 20/21 November 20/18.

The Animal Control Officer attended the Environmental Health and Animal Management Training Workshop 13-15 November 2018 on Palm Island. These workshops are hosted approximately every six months by the funding organisation Queensland Health. All Environmental Health and Animal Control staff are expected to attend. These workshops seem to be as much about networking and morale boosting as they are about actual training.

Participants received an update on the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Public Health Program. They received instruction in food safety and carried out practical inspections of two commercial food premises. Instruction was provided on the effects of housing on environmental health. A practical inspection was carried out on a newly constructed house looking at design features. Queensland Health food safety information promotional materials were given to participants.

The Animal Control Officer did observe that the Palm Island Council has a much better level of compliance regarding dogs around the shopping area. There may be a few reasons contributing to that. Palm Island has fewer residential buildings immediately adjacent to the shops and the houses there generally have better fencing.

Palm Island Council has also installed stronger messages in signage which is effective. To this extent, all dogs found in the shopping area are impounded. The community acknowledge this is a 'no dogs allowed area.' Similar signage could be considered for the Aurukun Town Square area which would require considerable communication with dog owners.

Director Community Services noted that the Animal Control Officer will only be sent to future events which include animal control topics.

### 6.8 Aurukun Waste Management Facility Upgrade Tender 006/18

### From Minutes of Ordinary Council Meeting 11 December 2018 Resolution 18.6194

That Council

- (1) notes the two recommendations set out in Item 17.1 from Director Technical Services with regards the management of the Aurukun Waste Management Facility Upgrade Tender 006/18 and Department of Local Government, Racing and Multicultural Affairs Project Number ASC.SW.01
- (2) refers further consideration of the two recommendations to its next Special Council Meeting on 22 January 2019.

The tender for the Aurukun Waste Management Facility closed on 22 October 2018 and Council received a tender evaluation from Aurecon recommending Bama Services Pty Ltd be awarded the contract for the sum of \$1,197,898.58. After reviewing the funding agreement, proposed design and the tenders submitted to Aurecon, the Acting Director Technical Services has identified the following issues:

The project as designed does not align sufficiently with the ICCIP funding objectives as listed in the agreement.

The project does not meet the Aurukun community's expectations.

The project fails to address the many long-standing issues with regards to waste disposal within the Aurukun Shire Council.

The project does not address the existing damaged leachate collection system nor its operation through the coming wet season.

The previous Acting Director Technical Services had determined that there needed to be an overall strategy developed for Aurukun's ongoing Landfill and Waste Management operation that suits local conditions and is "fit for purpose" and is designed specifically to suit local conditions.

#### Resolution 19.6219

- (1) does not proceed with any previous recommendations put forward by previous Acting Director Technical Services
- (2) requires the Mayor and CEO and Directors and Works Manager to discuss with Aurecon and Department of Local Government, Racing and Multicultural Affairs (Indigenous Council Critical Infrastructure Program) to determine the best way to proceed with the project
- (3) requests Aurecon to advise Bama Services Pty Ltd that Council does not intend to award the contract for Aurukun Waste Management Facility works until a thorough review of the proposed design outcomes and other issues are determined
- (4) forms an ASC project steering committee to assume responsibility for the implementation of this waste management facility project.
