CCTV Underway



manufacture of a CCTV system for the township of Aurukun with the system expected to be in operation in July.

Aurukun Mayor Dereck Walpo said plans for the installation of the CCTV system were progressing well with SAPE Industries currently manufacturing the system in its Townsville workshop.

"They anticipate bringing the state-of-the-art system to Aurukun on May 3 and taking eight weeks to install it with a completion date scheduled for June 30," he said.

"While the new system will not totally eliminate crime and anti-social behaviour in the township, Aurukun Shire Council is confident that a substantial reduction may occur.

"CCTV is part of a broader strategy to improve life in Aurukun as it has a proven track record in making security initiatives more effective in other areas including Palm Island, Cairns and Mt Isa.

"We are working hard with the Queensland Police Service to improve security together which includes Aurukun Shire Council hiring private security guards and funding the successful Community Police program employing local residents.

"Our focus includes refurbishing infrastructure to provide safe and welcoming places for members of the community to gather.

"We are assisting the establishment of a Police Citizens Youth Club within the Aurukun Sports Centre and Aurukun's library is being refurbished as an Indigenous Knowledge Centre which will engage residents through community radio and other initiatives.

"Expressions of interest will be invited to refurbish the Three Rivers Community Centre and provide a community engagement facility.

"Of course employment is high on the agenda and Council is proactively lobbying for business development to provide employment and training opportunities through initiatives such as the recent Aurukun Means Business Workshop."

"CCTV has proven very successful in many different locations in Queensland and around the world in stopping crime and making communities safer. The new CCTV system will make Aurukun safer for everyone who lives in and visits the community, and is a great example of what can be achieved when local, state and commonwealth governments work collaboratively together."

Dogs on show

Aurukun's famous sculptures and paintings are being snapped up by Brisbane art lovers with seven pieces bought on the first day of an exhibition at the Woolloongabba Art Gallery.

Aurukun Mayor Dereck Walpo said Wik and Kugu artists David Marpoondin, Lex Namponan, Bevan Namponan, Leigh Namponan and Garry Namponan created 20 sculptures and paintings which included birds, a crocodile and the highly acclaimed Aurukun dogs.

Member for Leichhardt Warren Entsch said from an arts perspective, the Aurukun Dogs had made the Aurukun community stand out from the rest.

"While the other art in this exhibition will be greatly appreciated, it has been the unique nature of the Aurukun Dogs which has attracted discerning collectors from around the world to personally travel to Aurukun – hoping to secure one of these unique and magnificent pieces of art," he said.

"The Aurukun Dogs will, without a doubt, keep the international focus on indigenous art firmly centred on Aurukun."

The Woolloongabba Art Gallery Exhibition is the Wik and Kugu Art Centre's first show for 2016 and will be closely followed by shows in Melbourne and the Cairns Indigenous Arts Fair in July. Garry is currently working on some development works for his upcoming solo show with Kick Arts Contemporary Art in Cairns during CIAF 2016.

He is using the markings he created for his dog sculptures as the basis for a design on new pre-stretched canvas from Create Art which he is painting with ochre and acrylic binders.

Aurukun means business

Business interest in the Cape York community of Aurukun has increased following a workshop hosted by Aurukun Shire Council on February 8-9.

Aurukun Shire Council Chief Executive Officer Bernie McCarthy said the Aurukun Means Business Workshop coincided with a visit by Rio Tinto to gauge the supply capability of Aurukun for the \$2.7 billion Amrun bauxite project and outline the business and employment opportunities that would arise from it.

"We had an overwhelming response to the workshop by outside companies and organisations from all around Australia with more than 60 people, including local businesses and residents, participating on the first day and about 75 attending on the second day," he said.

"Aurukun Shire Council hosted the sessions and provided town tours for workshop participants and Rio Tinto.

"The participants included smaller contractors through to large companies

from around Queensland and Western Australia.

"We spoke to these companies about the business opportunities in Aurukun which include housing construction, sewerage and road upgrades, refurbishment of the Sports Centre and Three Rivers Community Centre, training of staff, tourism in conjunction with Traditional Owners, cleaning and industrial estate development."

"Already we have had inquiries from companies looking at the viability of setting up in Aurukun both for work in Aurukun as well as business associated with the Amrun project.

"Attendees were advised that if their only interest was only the Amrun project, that they should attend the Rio sessions in Cairns or Weipa so we were delighted that so many came to Aurukun to see what opportunities were available in our township."



Rangers inspire kids

Aurukun's younger generation showed a keen interest in the activities of the APN Rangers at an Open Shed Day during the school holidays.

The rangers talked to the 22 children about what they did on country which helped them learn where their families came from and what animals were special. Four videos of the activities undertaken by the Rangers were shown and everyone enjoyed a barbecue lunch cooked by the PCYC.

They gathered food there so many of her paintings depicted the flowers and fruits she so fondly remembered.

The Akay Koo'oila Arts Centre celebrated International Women's Day with a morning tea (pictured). Elders joined representatives of Cape York Employment, local service providers and Family Responsibility Commissioners and Councillors for a morning tea of cakes and cheesecakes kindly donated by Island & Cape Retail Enterprises. School's in for Scott

Engagement with Aurukun school students and their families is a priority for Scott Fatnowna who

has just completed his first term as Head of Campus (Acting Principal) at Koolkan **Aurukun Community School.**

Scott has spent the past 20 years in Arnhem Land working at Numbulwar and Gapuwiyak schools where attendance rates have grown to 88 per cent and an increasing number of students are completing Year 12 and successfully finding work.

"I am one of eight new teaching staff at Aurukun who have been taking the time to get to know the people in the community which includes visiting the homes of their students." he said.

"The first half of the year is an observation and review process so I can learn what people see as important and I can try to build a culture that is inclusive of all the issues and barriers to school attendance.

"I have been fortunate to have tremendous support from the community which has been helped by my mother's bloodline coming from Aurukun and having connections with the Chevathun and Taisman families

"This is the first time I have walked on this country, but because of my bloodline I'm told daily of people feeling proud to have family sitting in this position.

"I decided to come here a long time ago, but I'm glad I waited until I became a principal because it gives me much more authority to sort out the challenges experienced in Aurukun."
