Our community has enjoyed much success over the past 12 months starting with our first Australia Day Citizenship Awards which will be run again next year.



The Wik and Kugu Art Centre received the Cairns Regional Art Centre Award and artist Garry Namponan won the Premier's Award for Excellence at the Cairns Indigenous Art Fair (CIAF). Bruce Bell and Garry Namponan also received the Thancoupie Bursary Award.

Chief Executive Officer Bernie McCarthy was a worthy recipient of the Public Service Medal in recognition of his service and leadership to local government over 47 years.

Aurukun's closed-circuit television (CCTV) security system, which is successfully reducing anti-social behaviour in the community, won the 2017 Australian Security Industry Awards for Excellence.

Next year we celebrate a major milestone – the 40th anniversary of Aurukun Shire Council. We are planning events throughout the year for the community to be involved in.

Top Students

Going to school regularly has paid off for 19 Aurukun State School students who were treated to a trip to Dreamworld and an insight into boarding school life after achieving 90-100% attendance.

Supervisor Kathy Ona said it was the first time all but one of the Year 1-6 students had travelled by plane from Aurukun to a city.

"It was a positive experience as they are now looking forward to attending boarding school as high school students," she said.

"They experienced staying at a boarding school, eating in dining halls, sharing rooms and travelling in a big city.

"The students were hosted by Djarragun College in Cairns and Runaway Bay Sports Centre on the Gold Coast."

"Aurukun students boarding at John Paul College gave them a tour of the school, we visited Aurukun's sister primary school, McGregor State School, and Marsden State School.

"The students were hosted by The Former Origin Greats ARTIE (Achieving Results for Indigenous Education) Academy.

"They were received well everywhere they went and we often had members of the public wanting to know who they were."

GRARRIOR TRAINING


Cadets in the Kapani Warrior Program head to Wujal Wujal this month for their next round of activities.

The job readiness program gets participants job ready for a career in Defence and helps prepare them for whatever career or occupational path they may choose.

Warrant Officer Allen Jolly from 51st Battalion, Far North Queensland Regiment said there had been 12 expressions of interest in the Program which is training men in Aurukun to re-establish the Aurukun army unit.

"We have a lot of keen fellas who have been learning to work together as a team and have established friendships through the program.

"Training will continue in February and March so we can have qualified patrolmen in Aurukun by the end of March."





CCTV Award

Aurukun's CCTV, which is reducing anti-social behaviour in the community, has won a 2017 Australian Security Industry Excellence award.

Installer Tyson Swarbrick from SAPE Industries accepted the trophy for a Special Security Event or Project worth more than \$500,000.

The CCTV is owned by Aurukun Shire Council and operated around the clock by Aurukun Police as part of a broader strategy to improve life in Aurukun.

The CCTV system is used extensively by the Aurukun Police to assist in crime prevention and identify offenders.

The ability to play back footage of actual occurrences in this community has dramatically reduced large scale unrest and ongoing community tensions.

Infrastructure damage and vandalism of Council property has been considerably reduced since the installation and there have been no vehicle thefts since October last year.

Artists a Hit

Wik and Kugu artists Garry Namponan, Bevan Namponan, Leigh Namponan, Lex Namponan, Vernon Marbendinar and Roderick Yunkaporta were treated like rock stars by art lovers at the National Gallery of Victoria Patron's Dinner in November.

The dinner was held in conjunction with the Past Legacy: Present Tense exhibition which includes 15 Wik and Kugu ku', Aurukun's famous camp dog carvings.

The eight Wik and Kugu artists attracted attention everywhere they went on the trip which included the Point Leo Estate Sculpture Park, Melbourne Zoo and the conservation area of the National Gallery.

Seeing their work on display was a highlight for the artists who undertook the professional development trip after winning the \$10,000 Art Centre Prize in the inaugural Cairns Indigenous Art Fair (CIAF) Art Awards.

Skytrans assisted with airfares and in return the artists carved model planes for Skytrans to give as corporate gifts.
