Community Safety Plan

Aurukun residents and stakeholders are invited to help develop a Community Safety Plan with consultations underway in the community.

Aurukun Shire Council Mayor Keri Tamwoy said the plan would document both the current and future response to community safety to improve the standard of living in the Aurukun township.

"Dr Chris McLaughlin of Culturev8 has been engaged by Council to consult with the community to develop the plan," she said.

"Last month Dr McLaughlin and council representatives had a stall in the Business Centre to help residents have their say and complete the survey.

"The Community Safety Plan will outline how Council will seek to enhance perceptions of safety, reduce crime and build community resilience.

"The strategic framework for this plan needs to reflect the current conditions in Aurukun and the wider Western Cape region as well as capture additional initiatives to effectively improve our standard of living.

"I urge all members of our community to have their say to ensure the plan meets





local needs and trust both residents and stakeholders will value being part of this planning phase."

The Community Safety Plan will feed into the Council's Corporate Plan once it is adopted in the New Year.



Thumarrie Fairies

Vera Koomeeta's painting of a beautiful lagoon in her country, Thumarrie, has been installed in the Cairns office of Aurukun Shire Council for guests to enjoy. Thumarrie is south of Aurukun Township with four main rivers in between – the Love River, then the Kirk River, followed by the Knox River and the North Kendall River. Vera says Thumarrie is about 2km to the south of Kirk River and 500m inland from the beach. Her grandparents told her about the Tom Thumb fairies which live in the lagoon. "My old people called these fairies Nguuthalpal. The lagoon is protected by the surrounding whispering oaks and mud mulch which is very soft to walk on. My Thumarrie lagoon is also rich in beauty with colourful waterlilies and sparkling crystal water. My country is forbidden for anyone to enter. There are other story places nearby that we don't want to be disturbed."



Gaining Experience



Alison Woolla was a former Mayor of Aurukun and dynamic reform leader who supported members of her community who were experiencing abuse. May Ballie and Myrtle Foote were the joint winners of the award for their work founding Pormpur Paanthu (Women's House) in Pormpuraaw.

Old Mission House

This painting of the old Aurukun Mission House was gifted to the Mayor by a relative of the artist, Sister Alison Cameron. Her niece Bev Brown wanted the painting to return to Aurukun as Sister Cameron's heart belonged with the Aurukun people and her ashes were scattered over Aurukun from a plane. The house was built in the early 1900s as the home of the Mission Superintendent. It became the first administration office of Aurukun Shire when the Council was formed in 1978. The bank and post office also operated from the premises which burnt to the ground in 1992. The Aurukun Supermarket now stands on the site.

Wik Whisper

Refuelling your vehicle in Aurukun will be much more comfortable in the wet season now that work has been completed to upgrade the retail fuel depot from dirt to concrete. It will also help to minimise the dust during the dry season. The boundary fence has been replaced and all work was funded by the Department of State Development, Tourism and Innovation.

Pathways have been laid along the Aurukun waterfront making access to this leisure area much easier for many members of the community. The work was done with Works 4 Queensland funding.

The Aurukun Justice Group works with the Aurukun police to solve community issues. Sergeant Stuart Greenwell and Justice Group members Harriet Pootchemunka and Noreen Walmbeng met recently to discuss local issues.

Community Police Officer Paddy Bell assisted Kate Smith from One Health Veterinary Solutions with house-to-house visits and animal care in the Aurukun township. One Health provides veterinary health visits, surgical services and council management support to remote Indigenous communities.

Aurukun stopped to remember the 11 Aurukun men who enlisted with the Torres Strait Infantry as part of the Remembrance Day commemorations today. Mayor Keri Tamwoy spoke about remembering the

102,800 Australians who gave their lives for their country and the significance of the day.

Each month Aurukun Shire Council's Chivaree Centre hosts a luncheon

for all Aurukun senior citizens. Jock Eundatumweakin and Lois Toikalkin received lucky door prizes. Olive Kepple sang the Grace with the Elders joining in. A big thank you to new Head Cook Robert Walker and also the Assistant Cook Virginia Namponan for preparing the meal.
