6.1 Human Resources Policies Review

6.1.1 ASC Staff Pool Vehicle Policy – HR013

Review and update of current policy is required due to high booking requests from Contractors/Temporary staff which is resulting in ASC permanent staff (Aurukun based) not being able to have access to ASC pool vehicle.

Use of workplace vehicles is covered under the Work Health and Safety Act 2011 therefore ASC recommends all permanent staff driving an ASC vehicle or pool car to undertake some form of 'Off Road Driving Course'.
