DTS informed the Council that they received the infrastructure, trained but no troubleshooting and the system as a whole has had nothing but trouble, breakdowns and inconsistent readings right from the start. We have received no back up from the supplier and the grant does not cover the running costs of the program. There have been other Councils removing Fluoride from their water systems such as Gladstone and Mackay Councils. DTS proposed that maybe the selling of the infrastructure to Rio Tinto is feasible at their removal cost

Building Supervisor to draw plans in relation to the Tree House and DTS to make a recommendation that the installation of a bathroom would be a better option. External gardens to install the fake green grass, no maintenance and cool. Irrigation system to be installed to the remaining grassed areas and general tidy up of the area. No internal structures to change. Nothing was allowed for air conditioning. Research the possibility of funding to assist with the refurbishments. - 1. Petrol Sniffing is creeping back into the community. It is requested that the three organisations work together to control this. ASC requested to distribute a message to all Aurukun Staff to ensure that all non Opal Fuel and Methylated spirits needs to be locked away each day.
- 2. Daily visits to the school from the Police
- 3. There is a drug and alcohol hot line set up to report alcohol within the community.
- 4. Brendon reported on the progress of the Optic Fibre cable. Will definitely be rolled out by 31 March, 2017 with the possibility of being in Aurukun by Christmas. Brendon has a copy of the contract and will forward it to the CEO for comments.
- 5. CEO proposed regular interagency meetings possibly the last Thursday of every month. These meetings are to be more selective with the attendees. Two email lists are to be created:
 - a. The first list is to be CEO, Mayor, Directors x 1 and agency
 - b. The second list is to be larger for the distribution of information within the community.
- 6. There is a taskforce being set up to relocate the homeless people in Cairns back to their homeland of Aurukun. This taskforce is in the early stages and is yet to confirm how this is to be achieved. CEO agrees with them returning to Aurukun and is willing to help the taskforce. It was proposed that before they return that they have a health check, that they are employment ready with Centrelink paperwork in place and that they are housing ready with the DHPW.
- 7. Positive changes are on the way for the Police Department in Aurukun with Senior Sargent Brett Jenkins leading the Police Station.

Rio Tinto had prepared a presentation however as the Council was short of time they said that they would email it to the CEO. They discussed a number of items which included:

- 3. Project construction is 20% complete which is only 10% of the structure;

- 5. With regards to employing more Wik Waya people they have to meet selection criteria (determined by WCCCA) which involves having a medical, Drivers Licence, DNA, reading and writing tests.
