11.1.7 Interim report recommendations Healthy Community Consultative Report

The first stage of the healthy communities footpath grant has been completed at a cost of about \$11,071. The following are recommendations concerning the location of the footpaths and a map is attached. Council needs to approve construction based on the consultation recommendations below in order to receive the remaining \$14,900 for construction.

"Council to consider the construction of a network of pathways along the existing roads and streets within the Council Boundaries that will address the current lack of appropriate footpaths in the community and increase the safety of pedestrians, therefore creating a healthier community.

This network to include:

- A loop that follows the length of Kang Kang Road, Airport Drive, the shortcut (oto the cemetery and landing), Tal Tal Street to the landing and cemetery and MacKenzie Drive:
- Kang Kang Road to have footpaths on both sides of road;
- Access to offshoots that includes Airport Estate (Bowenda and Kleidon Drives), Wuungkam Lane, Themp Street and Kenh Lane (between shop and Guesthouse)'
- Appropriate shelters at adequate intervals with concrete seating and table provisions - including one at the mango tree near the cemetery and landing;
- Adequate and maintained toilet block at the landing which also services the cemetery;
- Footpaths to be built of concrete rather than bauxite or compacted earth;
- Footpaths to be elevated with appropriate drainage in consideration of wet season flooding issues;

- Footpaths to be large enough for two (2) people ie 120 cm or more.
- The incorporation of a Public Art Project into the construction of areas of the path, the shelters, benches and tables.
- A training program be involved in the construction of the footpaths.

A focus on improving exercise opportunities could find stronger support through organising a range of short and long distance community walks and cultural camps.

Recommendations:

- 13.4942 RESOLVED THAT Council adopts the above recommendations with the following amendments:
 - (i) Toilet block, Public Art and Shelters are not covered by the grant only pathways and even if these items were covered there would be little change left out of the \$14,900 to construct the pathways, therefore these items to be deleted from the current grant.
 - (ii) Preference for the paths to be constructed using bauxite rather than concrete as the money will go further.
 - (iii) Elevation of the paths no more than 20mm as if they go any higher they will interfere with the sheet flow in the wet season.
 - (iv) Kang Kang Road to have only one footpath.
 - (v) As further funding becomes available under other infrastructure grants the network be extended in line with the attached map.
