The entire community will benefit from reliable high-speed internet with installation close to completion. This will make everyday tasks like banking simpler, dramatically increase the entertainment and leisure options for our remote community and most importantly be conducive to new businesses setting up in Aurukun.

Tourism offers an incredible opportunity for Traditional Owners to start a business and share their culture and I am pleased to see plans moving forward. Cape York Alliance, Cape York Sustainable Futures and Tourism Cape York recently held a tourism and business enterprise workshop for our community.

Access to Aurukun is improving with a Memorandum of Understanding between Rio Tinto and Aurukun Shire Council resulting in \$3.8 million being spent over four years to maintain and improve the Aurukun Access Road.

Our Wik and Kugu artists are enjoying a growing demand for their work and their ku' (camp dog) carvings were among the most popular pieces of art at the Cairns and Indigenous Art Fair this year.

Library services have returned with the opening of the Wik Mungkan Indigenous Knowledge Centre which also gives our community access to the internet and school holiday activities for our children.

The new PCYC facilities boast the best gym equipment in Cape York and have some great programs aimed at encouraging our community to adopt a healthy lifestyle.

IKC CELEBRATIONS reasurer and Minister for Aboriginal and Torres

opened the Wik Mungkan Indigenous Knowledge

More than 70 people attended including Department of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Partnerships Director General Clare O'Connor and State Library Queensland Executive Director of Regional Access and Public Libraries Louise Denoon.

Mayor Dereck Walpo said it was a very exciting time for Aurukun as the Indigenous Knowledge Centre (IKC) had a long history in the community, having first opened on November

"Over the past year, Aurukun Shire Council, in partnership with the State Library of Queensland, has committed significant resources to the refurbishment of the building to revitalise the IKC and ensure its relevance to community needs." he said.

"Since September, we have had a steady stream of visitors to the Centre with 59 new members signing up and I hope many more will make good use of this wonderful facility and cultural learning environment."

Mayor Walpo welcomed newly appointed IKC coordinator Priscilla Blanco who has worked as a teacher's aide and health care worker throughout Cape York Peninsula and was the team leader for Act for Kids in Aurukun.

Ms Blanco, from Aurukun's Winchanam clan, said she spent most of her childhood holidays in Aurukun as her grandfather, William Hudson, was a stockman who worked in the community and its outstations.

The \$120,000 refurbishment by Aurukun Shire Council received \$28,000 from the State Government. The Council has a partnership with the State Library of Queensland for the operation of the IKC. This includes almost \$40,000 in funding towards staff, materials, the First 5 Forever program, promotional and membership initiatives, and assistance to reactivate the Indigenous Knowledge Centre via an arts and culture program.



Cairns Office Opens

Aurukun Shire Council celebrated the opening of its Cairns office with about 50 people including Minister for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Partnerships Curtis Pitt and Cairns Mayor Bob Manning on September 22.

Aurukun Mayor Dereck Walpo said the new office would accommodate Council's eight Cairns-based support staff including business development, grants management, finance, purchasing, payroll and information technology functions.

"These staff visit Aurukun on a regular rotation basis and all senior management staff are located in Aurukun Shire Council's head office in the Aurukun community," he said.

"The Cairns-based staff provide much-needed support for the Council, the management team and their colleagues based in Aurukun.

"This new office will provide significant financial, administrative and cost-saving benefits for the council as our property investment will cease outgoing rent-related costs and increase profits through council leasing any unused space.

"This strategic and financially-sound business decision will mean savings of about \$100,00 per annum."
